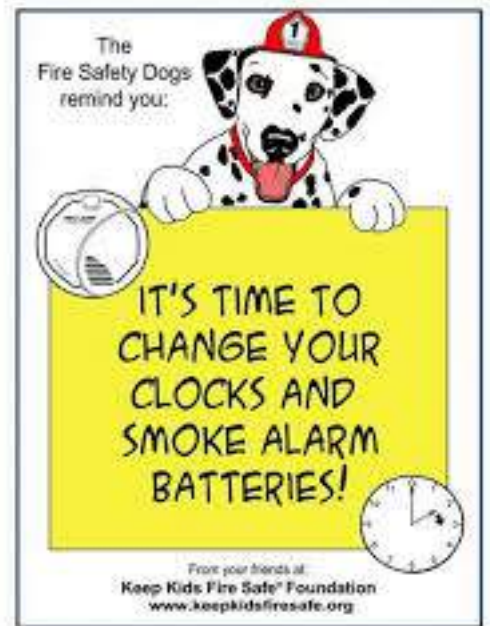

It's always great to be recognized for something special that you and your dog have accomplished, so this is what our club does to recognize what you have done:

DESCRIPTION OF GABOC AWARDS PROGRAM

Members whose dogs earn an AKC title during the year, have met the Awards eligibility requirements, and complete the title awards form worksheet, are entitled to be recognized for their accomplishment at next years banquet. This is what you will get:

- A GABOC 8x10 picture plaque, engraved with your dog's name, when the first AKC title is earned.
- A gold title plate (to be attached on the GABOC plaque), engraved with the title letters and date it was earned, for all AKC, CKC & UKC titles earned.

CERTIFICATE AWARDS:

Since we are an AKC licensed obedience club, special gift certificate awards will be given to those members meeting the awards eligibility requirements and earning the specific titles listed below. Gift certificates may be used towards the purchase of any dog related expenditure, with signed receipt of purchase.

- CD Title: GABOC plaque (If the plaque has already been awarded for another AKC title, a \$30.00 gift certificate will be awarded)
- CDX Title: \$ 50.00 gift certificate
- UD Title: \$100.00 gift certificate
- UDX Title: \$150.00 gift certificate
- OTCH Title: \$200.00 gift certificate
- MACH Title: \$200.00 gift certificate
- CT Title: \$200.00 gift certificate



SPECIAL ACKNOWLEDGEMENT AWARDS:

A GABOC 5x7 picture plaque will be awarded to the members who achieve the following special acknowledgments. (*You do not need to meet the Awards eligibility requirements to be eligible for these special plaques.*)

- Highest scoring member from each day of our annual Obedience trial
- Highest scoring member in Novice A (Karl Schmidt Award), from each day of our Obedience trial
- Highest scoring member from each day of our annual Rally trial

GABOC “HALL OF FAME” AWARDS:

GABOC has a special photo album containing 8x10 pictures of all members' dogs who have earned “Hall of Fame” status. The following achievements would automatically make a dog eligible. (*You do not need to meet the Awards eligibility requirements to be eligible for Hall of Fame.*)

- Outstanding achievements, other than those accomplished in the obedience ring and those investigated by the Board and approved. (First in the breed to accomplish something, acts of heroism, etc)
- A UD, UDX or OTCH
- A VST or TDX, accompanied by a CD title
- An Amateur Field Championship, accompanied by a CD title
- A Master Hunter, accompanied by a CD title
- A Herding Champion, accompanied by a CD title
- A MACH, accompanied by a CD title
- A Breed Champion, accompanied by a CD title
- A Champion Tracker, accompanied by a CD title
- A Rally Champion (RNC)
- Any additional AKC disciplines that award a CH title, accompanied by a CD title

If you have not met the Awards eligibility requirements, or would like to order plaques/plates for a non-covered organization, you may purchase those plaques/plates at actual cost. If you would like to order plaques/plates from previous years, you may do so at actual cost.

There's still plenty of time to earn titles this year, so good luck and **see you at the banquet!**

AWARDS REQUIREMENTS



Members who choose to receive an award paid for by the club may do so by fulfilling and documenting the requirements on the awards form (available on the club website or at the club) for the year in which the title was earned. *Special circumstances, such as contributing to the club by doing activities not listed in the requirements, will not exempt members from completing all requirements.*

The following requirements must be met:

- **MEETINGS**

Six general membership meetings are held before board meetings, in February, April, June, August, October, and November. You must attend a general membership or board meeting in two different months. Dates and locations will be announced.

- **MONDAY NIGHT TRAINING and/or SUNDAY TRACKING SESSIONS**

You must train at least twelve Mondays at the GABOC facility, or participate in twelve regular Sunday tracking sessions, or any combination totaling twelve.

- **TRIALS**

You must work a total of four hours at GABOC trials. These hours can be served at our obedience trials, agility trials, tracking tests, or any combination of trials/tests, as long as the accumulated total is four hours. Your service can be to steward, set up, take down, etc., or perform any other duty required to help run the event.

ELECTIVE REQUIREMENT

In addition to the Meetings, Training/Tracking, and Trials requirements, you must also complete one of the following options:

Matches: Serve as a steward or judge at one match without accepting payment.

Committees/Projects: Chair or serve on a club committee or club project.

Additional Training: Train an additional six Monday nights and/or Sunday tracking sessions.

Board members, club officers, instructors, and table helpers are exempt from the elective requirement

Six general membership meetings are held before board meetings, in the months listed. You must attend a general membership or board meeting in two different months and record the dates below. Dates and locations will be announced.

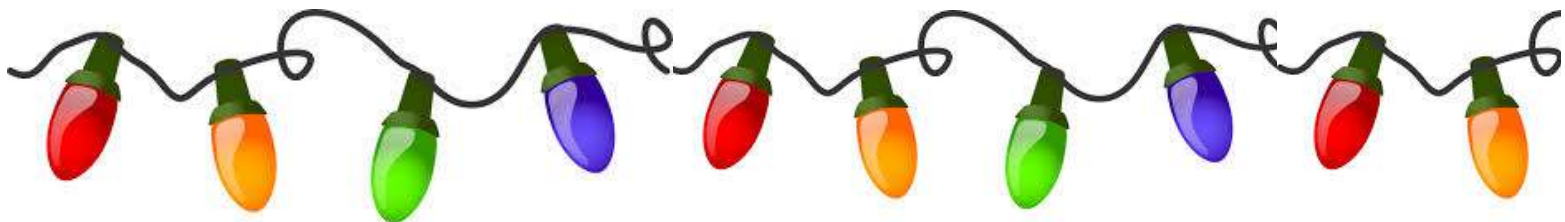

JENNA A NEW BEGINNING RN, CGCA, TKN

Jenna's been a busy girl these past few months. We got her the beginning of October 2017 a month after Devon passed away. We were so lonely and sad that Andy (IDR's president), suggested we foster Jenna whom was thought to be six. Rescue picked her up and her chip revealed she was eight. Eight was fine because I wanted an older calm Dobe.



The day she was delivered she had a dental and was supposed to be spayed. Her teeth were so bad she could not stay under any longer. She also had a serious looking hernia and it was quite obvious that she had been a mom many times. Two weeks later Jenna was spayed and due to her added hernia surgery she could not run, jump or do stairs for six weeks.

Fortunately Bill made a pen in the backyard for her because this eight year old that I thought would be calm, still had a lot of prey drive for an old gal. I could not have walked her on a leash for six weeks.

We did some training in the winter but bad weather keeps me home.

Jenna got her CGC in March and her Novice Trick Dog early summer.

The Doberman National was at Pheasant Run in October and I wanted Jenna to participate. We had Sox tickets for Dog Days the end of September too. Jenna was not fond of other dogs. If we were going to accomplish all this we had some work to do.

We took a summer six weeks class with Roc Solid at the park district. It ended up being outside which was great for Jenna with all the distractions, people, dogs, kids, etc.



Jenna had occasionally come to Glenbard's afternoon training and she was very distracted by the other two or three dogs. I knew I needed to get her into the evening classes. I held my breath and started with a Rally run through. Mary Therese was very helpful. The following week Karen Schlipf welcomed us into her class. Glenbard's fun match was coming up and I had a time conflict. Joan told me to get there early and they could take me. It went decent and I was so happy to get in and out.

My small obedience club had a function and Jenna got her Advanced CGC.

I also started taking Jenna to the German Shepherd club on Thursdays. She was getting better about new places. Later we progressed to their Rally class and fun match.

I felt ready for the Sox game. It was a lot for Jenna to take in. There were probably 300 or more dogs in attendance that night. We got some rain which thinned out the crowd.

The week before the National we did a Thursday night at Fox Valley. For a new larger place she was good.

It was three long days at the National, but hard work does pay off. Jenna got her Rally Novice title but only one Beginner Novice leg, with a second place for the Dobs and a third place for all breed. We were in a run-off with another Dobe for that second place.



We also went through the WAE which is a temperament test for the Dobermans. She did everything except go out the last time at the decoy. Even though she did not pass the evaluator said I had a nice sold bitch. I told him her story and I was very proud of her progress.

The last night of our National is the fund raiser banquet for health and rescue. Jenna was in the parade of rescues of eight Dobs that takes place before dinner.

She's come a long way in one year and without all the great clubs we have and several people who helped us along the way we not have been able to accomplish all this.

I hope to get those last two Beginner Novice legs soon.

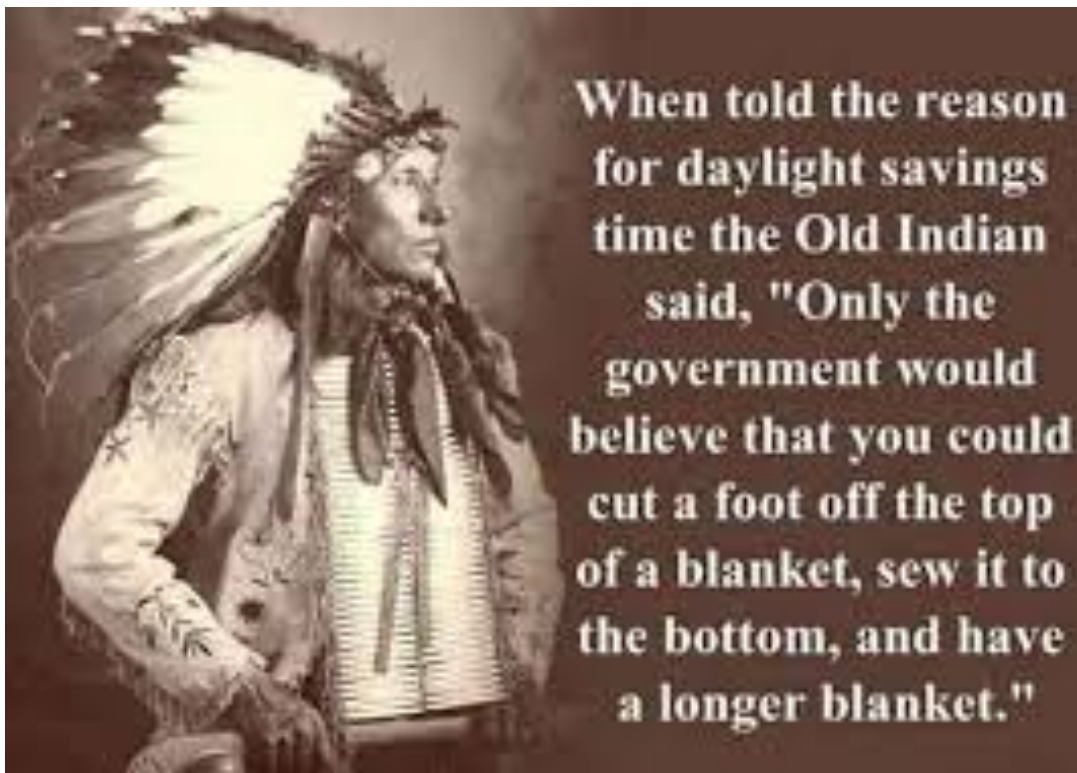

Member Highlight~

Karen Schlipf

My family had Cocker Spaniels and a German Shepherd when I was young. When I was a teenager my family got a miniature poodle (Pepe). I went with my mom as she trained Pepe with the Chicago Poodle Club and watched the training. We moved to St. Charles in 1961 and we acquired Pepe's daughter (a miniature apricot poodle) Christine. She was given to me to train. I joined the 4-H program at FVDTC and trained her to a CD and high scores.. My family got a Newf when I was in college. My mom said I was the dog trainer in the family so it fell to me to train Heidi. She was a challenge. What a difference between my bright spiffy poodle and my Newf who kept saying "why?" and "you wanted it in this century"? I got a CD on her and became an assistant at FVDTC under Ellen Sidwell. After a year, Ellen left the area and gave me the class to run. I honestly felt unqualified to run a class but I did the best I could. Enter Pinny Wendell (who had just moved into the area). She brought me to Jack and Wendy Volhard's training camps where I learned "how" to teach. I was subsequently brought on staff and taught all levels for them for 34 years. I taught people from around the world, some with dog breeds I had never heard of. During this time I taught at FVDTC for 13 years and judged many of their matches, assisted Pinny in her classes, taught classes at Waubensee Community College. I became a member of the working dog committee of the Newfoundland Club of America for about 10 years. I participated in reworking the water dog regulations and completely revamping the draft dog regulations. I put multiple obedience, water, and draft titles on all my Newfs.





When I moved to Wheaton I joined Pinny's classes, New Friend Dog Obedience, full time and eventually took over teaching all the classes. I was teaching so much I needed a place to train my own dogs. Pinny and I attended some drop in classes at Glenbard. I was pleased with the number of Newfs there (and former students). I liked Dick Schaefer's class. He knew I wanted criticism and I got it! I was also pleased when GABOC started their Monday afternoon ring rentals. This way I could train multiple dogs (some in the afternoon and then in the evening). This became even more important when GABOC asked me to take over Dave Parison's class (I was honored). Under Dick's strict eye I put a CD and CDX on Qaatja (with very good scores and even won a run-off) and a CGC on a client's Newf. I look forward to many more fun years training and teaching at GABOC.
